AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 7, SEWER SERVICE,  
SECTION 7.07, SEWER USE RATES, OF THE PALESTINE VILLAGE CODE

BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Palestine, Crawford County, Illinois, that CHAPTER 7, SEWER SERVICE, Section 7.07 SEWER USE RATES of the Palestine Village Code, as amended, be, and the same is hereby amended to be as follows:

7.07 SEWER USE RATES. These are established rates or charges for the use of and services supplied by the sanitary sewerage system of the Village of Palestine, as follows:

CLASSIFICATION AND MONTHLY CHARGES

Domestic: (Either permanent or mobile structure):

- For each unit of residence of human habitation, whether permanent or mobile, each mobile home, apartment or dwelling adapted for residential use being considered one unit: \$11.00
- For churches, a flat charge of: \$11.00
- For institutions a charge of \$1.25 per month for each toilet installation in excess of one, plus a flat rate of: \$11.00
- For hospitals or nursing homes, a charge of \$1.25 per month for each toilet installation in excess of one, plus a flat charge of: \$11.00
- For rooming houses, a charge of \$1.25 per month for each toilet installation in excess of one, plus a flat charge for each separate apartment of: \$11.00

Monthly rates shall be determined by the nature of usage of the sewer of the Village. The fact that multiple dwelling or mercantile units may be discharged into a common sewer outlet

before discharging into the Village sewer shall not relieve the individual users or owners hereof from responsibility for the monthly flat charge herein fixed.

Store, offices, mercantile and industrial establishments  
(not otherwise classified):

For toilet or sink or lavatory installation, not  
to exceed two of each \$11.00

For public laundries (with or without restroom  
facilities) \$14.50

For combined grocery store, public laundry and  
car wash \$40.00

Lodge and club room:

For toilet or sink or lavatory installation,  
not to exceed two of each \$11.00

For toilet or sink or lavatory installation,  
exceeding two of each \$24.50

Public buildings, schools and parks:

Monthly charge for connection of facility  
to sewer \$11.00

Barber shops:

For toilet or sink or lavatory, not to exceed  
two of each \$11.00

Garages and service stations:

Garages or service stations without wash racks  
or floor drains \$11.00

Garage or service stations with wash rack or  
floor drains \$13.50

Restaurants, taverns, and soft drink parlors:

For toilet or sink or lavatory installation,  
not to exceed two of each \$13.50

Creameries, meat packing plants, poultry houses,  
and other waste producing industries not  
otherwise classified:

For any toilet or drain installations \$14.50

Rural connections (a rural connection is one where  
the sewer usage originates outside of the limits  
of the Village:

For rural private connections with or without  
toilet \$13.50

In an industrial installation where the use of water is  
large, the rate for sewerage use shall be subject to revision  
on account of quantity discharged into sewers and the  
strength or treatment demand of the sewage. The basis of any  
rate to be applied in such cases shall be the relation of  
treatment to demand and quantity of waste discharge into  
sewers as compared with sewage from household establishments  
and the rate shall be in equitable proportions.


This Ordinance shall be effective for sewerage service  
commencing January 1, 2006.

after its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form as  
provided by law.
