ORDINANCE NO. 2008-O- 02

AN ORDINANCE TO CONDEMN AN UNSAFE BUILDING
AT 205 N. RUSH STREET, PALESTINE, ILLINOIS

BE IT ORDAINED that the Village Board of the Village of Palestine, Crawford County, Illinois, that it has been determined that the building situated upon the premises located at 205 N. Rush Street, Palestine, Illinois, and more particularly described:

Lot No. 10 in N. Steel's First Addition to the Village of Palestine, situated in Crawford County, Illinois.

is dangerous and unsafe and abandoned and should be either put in a safe condition or demolished; and accordingly, said building located at 205 N. Rush Street, Palestine, Crawford County, Illinois, is hereby declared to be unsafe and dangerous and is condemned.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that the Village Attorney be directed to commence proceedings under the Unsafe Building Statute, as provided for under the laws of the State of Illinois, and to give 30 days written notice by mail to said owners to either place said building in a safe condition or to demolish it and to follow the other procedures as provided by law.


