AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH THE PREVAILING RATE
OF WAGES WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF PALESTINE,
CRAWFORD COUNTY, ILLINOIS, FOR 2008

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has enacted "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workmen employed in any public body or any political subdivision or by anyone under contract for public works", approved June 26, 1941, as amended, Illinois Compiled Statutes 820 ILCS 130/1 through 130/12.

WHEREAS, the aforesaid Act requires that the Village of Palestine investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages as defined in said Act for laborers, mechanics, and other workmen in the locality of said Village employed in performing construction of public works for said Village.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Village of Palestine, Crawford County, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1. To the extent and as required by "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workmen employed in any public works by the State, County, City or any public body or any political subdivision, or by anyone under contract for public work", approved June 26, 1941, as amended, the general prevailing rate of wages in this locality for laborers, mechanics and other workmen engaged in the construction of public works coming under the jurisdiction of the Village of Palestine is hereby ascertained to be the same as the prevailing rate of wages for construction work in the Crawford County area as determined by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois as of May 1, 2008, a copy of that determination being attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. The definition of any terms appearing in this Ordinance which are also used in the aforesaid Act shall be the same as in said act.

Section 2. Nothing herein contained shall be construed to apply said general prevailing rate of wages as herein ascertained to any work or employment except public works construction of the Village to the extent required by the aforesaid Act.

Section 3. The Village Clerk shall publicly post or keep available for inspection by any interested party in the Village of Palestine, Village Hall, Palestine, Illinois, this determination of such prevailing rate of wage.

Section 4. The Village Clerk shall mail a copy of this determination to any employer and to any association of employers and to any person or association of employees who have filed their names and addresses requesting copies of any determination stating the particular rates and the particular class of workers whose wages will be affected by such rates.

Section 5. The Village Clerk shall promptly file a certified copy of this Ordinance with both the Secretary of State and the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois.

Explanations

CRAWFORD COUNTY

The following list is considered as those days for which holidays of wages for work performed apply: New Years Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Veterans Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day. Generally, any of these holidays which fall on a Sunday is celebrated on the following Monday. This then means that work performed on that Monday payable at the appropriate overtime holiday pay. Common practice in a given local may alter the day of celebration such as the day after Thanksgiving for Veterans Day. If in doubt, please check with IDOL.

Oil and chip resealing (O&C) means the application of road liquid asphalt to coat an existing road surface, followed by

application of aggregate chips or gravel to coated surface, subsequent rolling of material to seal the surface.

EXPLANATION OF CLASSES

ASBESTOS - GENERAL - removal of asbestos material/mold and materials from any place in a building, including mechanical systems where those mechanical systems are to be removed. This includes removal of asbestos materials/mold and hazardous materials ductwork or pipes in a building when the building is to be demolished at the time or at some close future date.

ASBESTOS - MECHANICAL - removal of asbestos material from mechanical systems, such as pipes, ducts, and boilers, where the mechanical systems are to remain.

CERAMIC TILE FINISHER, MARBLE FINISHER, TERRAZZO FINISHER

Assisting, helping or supporting the tile, marble and terra mechanic by performing their historic and traditional work required to complete the proper installation of the work called said crafts. The term "Ceramic" is used for naming the class only and is in no way a limitation of the product handled. This class takes into consideration most hard tiles.

COMMUNICATION SYSTEMS TECHNICIAN

Installation, operation, inspection, maintenance, repair, and testing of radio, television, recording, voice sound and vision reproduction apparatus, equipment and appliances used for commercial, education, entertainment and private telephone systems.

TRUCK DRIVER - BUILDING, HEAVY AND HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION

Class 1. Drivers on 2 axle trucks hauling less than 9 ton. equipment, compressor and welding machines and brooms, including those separate units, truck driver helpers, warehouse employees, helpers, greasers and tiremen, pickup trucks when hauling materials, tools, or workers to and from and on-the-job site, and for trucks up to 6,000 lb. capacity.

Class 2. Two or three axle trucks hauling more than 9 ton and less than 16 ton. A-frame winch trucks, hydrolift trucks, dump trucks or similar equipment when used for transportation purposes.

Fork lifts over 6,000 lb. capacity, winch trucks, four axle combination units, and ticket writers.

Class 3. Two, three or four axle trucks hauling 16 ton or Drivers on water pulls, articulated dump trucks, mechanics forepersons, and dispatchers. Five axle or more combinati

Class 4. Low Boy and Oil Distributors.

Class 5. Drivers who require special protective clothing w employed on hazardous waste work.

TRUCK DRIVER - OIL AND CHIP RESEALING ONLY.

This shall encompass laborers, workers and mechanics who dr contractor or subcontractor owned, leased, or hired pickup, service, or oil distributor trucks. The work includes tran materials and equipment (including but not limited to, oils supplies, parts, machinery and tools) to or from the job si distributing oil or liquid asphalt and aggregate; stock pil material when in connection with the actual oil and chip co The Truck Driver (Oil & Chip Resealing) wage classification include supplier delivered materials.

OPERATING ENGINEERS - BUILDING, HEAVY AND HIGHWAY CONSTRUCT

Class 1. Power Cranes, Draglines, Derricks, Shovels, Grada Mechanics, Tractor Highlift, Tournadozer, Concrete Mixers w Tournamixer, Two Drum Machine, One Drum Hoist with Tower o Cableways, Tower Machines, Motor Patrol, Boom Tractor, Boom Truck, Winch or Hydraulic Boom Truck, Truck Crane, Tournap Tractor Operating Scoops, Bulldozer, Push Tractor, Asphalt Finishing Machine on Asphalt, Large Rollers on Earth, Rolle Asphalt Mix, Ross Carrier or similar Machine, Gravel Proces Machine, Asphalt Plant Engineer, Paver Operator, Dredging E or Dredge Engineer, or Dredge Operator, Central Mix Plant CMI or similar type machine, Concrete Pump, Truck or Skid M Tower Crane, Engineer or Rock Crusher Plant, Concrete Plan Ditching Machine with dual attachment, Tractor Mounted Load Cherry Picker, Hydro Crane, Standard or Dinkey Locomotives, Scoopmobiles, Euclid Loader, Soil Cement Machine, Back Fill

Elevating Machine, Power Blade, Drilling Machine, including Testing, Caissons, Shaft or any similar type drilling mach
Driven Paint Machine, Pipe Cleaning Machine, Pipe Wrapping
Pipe Bending Machine, Apsco Paver, Boring Machine, (Head E Greaser), Barber-Greene Loaders, Formless Paver, (Well Poin Concrete Spreader, Hydra Ax, Span Saw, Marine Scoops, Brush Brush Burner, Mesh Placer, Tree Mover, Helicopter Crew (3), Piledriver-Skid or Crawler, Stump Remover, Root Rake, Tug B Operator, Refrigerating Machine, Freezing Operator, Chair Self-Propelled, Hydra Seeder, Straw Blower, Power Sub Grade Float, Finishing Machine, Self-Propelled Pavement Breaker, similar type Machine), Two Air Compressors, Compressors hoo Manifold, Overhead Crane, Chip Spreader, Mud Cat, Sull-Air, (except when used for landscaping work), Soil Stabilizer (Tiller, Bo Mag, Rago Gator, and similar types of equipment) Float, Spray Machine, Curing Machine, Concrete or Asphalt Machine, Snooper Truck-Operator, Backhoe, Farm Tractors (wi attachments), 4 Point Lift System (Power Lift or similar ty Skid-Steer (Bob Cat or similar type), Wrecking Shears, Wate

Class 2. Concrete Mixers without Skips, Rock Crusher, Ditch Machine under 6', Curbing Machine, One Drum Machines without Boom, Air Tugger, Self-Propelled Concrete Saw, Machine Mouth Hole Digger, two to four Generators, Water Pumps or Welding within 400 feet, Air Compressor 600 cu. ft. and under, Roll Aggregate and Seal Coat Surfaces, Fork Lift (when used for work), Concrete and Blacktop Curb Machine, One Water Pump, Air Valves or Steam Valves, One Welding Machine, Truck Jack Gunnite Machine, House Elevators when used for hoisting material Engine Tenders, Fireman, Wagon Drill, Flex Plane, Conveyor and Pulsometer, Switchman, Fireman on Paint Pots, Fireman on Plants, Distributor Operator on Trucks, Tampers, Self-Propelled Broom, Striping Machine (motor driven), Form Tamper, Bulk Cement Plant, Equipment Greaser, Deck Hands, Truck Crane Oiler-Drum Cement Blimps, Form Grader, Temporary Heat, Throttle Valve, Sucker (and similar type of equipment).

Other Classifications of Work:

For definitions of classifications not otherwise set out, the Department generally has on file such definitions which are available. If a task to be performed is not subject to one of the

classifications of pay set out, the Department will upon b contacted state which neighboring county has such a classif provide such rate, such rate being deemed to exist by refer this document. If no neighboring county rate applies to t the Department shall undertake a special determination, suc determination being then deemed to have existed under this determination. LANDSCAPING

Landscaping work falls under the existing classifications f operating engineer and truck driver. The work performed by plantsman and landscape laborer is covered by the existing classification of laborer. The work performed by landscape (regardless of equipment used or its size) is covered by t classifications of operating engineer. The work performed landscape truck drivers (regardless of size of truck driven covered by the classifications of truck driver.
